

MINISTER'S LETTER

Our April newsletter was always going to be about Holy Week and Easter. Issued as usual on the first Sunday of the month, in this case Palm Sunday, I would under normal circumstances have been commending to your support the various services both in Canongate Kirk and in our neighbouring churches, beginning with the now traditional Palm Sunday afternoon pilgrimage down the Royal Mile from the Mercat Cross to the Abbey at Holyroodhouse. But these are not normal circumstances and none of these services and events can go ahead.

This does not mean however that - like Wimbledon and the Edinburgh International Festival and so many other annual fixtures - Holy Week and Easter have been cancelled! It just means we have to mark them in different ways this year, more individual ways certainly but perhaps more meaningful ways too. Do you still have a palm cross from last year? Perhaps you could use it to mark in your Bible the Palm Sunday reading at St Matthew 21:1-11. And then follow the story as it unfolds day by day in St John 12:1-11; 12:20-36; 13:21-32; 13:1-17 & 31-35; and on Good Friday, St John 18 & 19. The Gospel reading set for Easter Day this year is St John 20:1-18. Keep your eye on our website too, where Breda Ludik and I shall share reflections and prayers for each day from Palm Sunday to Easter and every Sunday thereafter, and I will even attempt a video message for Easter Day! Every church with a website is using it in different and imaginative ways, but these readings are from the lectionary, shared in common not just with our neighbouring churches but with the worldwide family of the Church. As the whole world struggles with this appalling global pandemic, may they help us to connect with Christian people everywhere, as in our own homes we turn together to these passages for comfort and inspiration. May God bless to us these readings from His holy word, and to His name be glory and praise.

Give we the glory and praise to the Lamb; Take we the robe and the harp and the palm; Sing we the song of the lamb that was slain, Dying in weakness, but rising to reign.
