

#### **MINISTER'S LETTER**

"Muster, March and Remember" was the theme of the Royal Regiment of Scotland's recent reunion of those who had served in the Regiment since its formation from its various antecedent Regiments on 28<sup>th</sup> March 2006. At the conclusion of their weekend of events, a contingent marched down the Royal Mile behind the Band of the Royal Regiment of Scotland and came to a halt outside Canongate Kirk, the Regimental Kirk, before joining the congregation already mustered for our morning service on Sunday 26<sup>th</sup> March. The Band came in too and played from the gallery and it all made for a most memorable service. A newly commissioned Memorial Board was given pride of place on the chancel step and has now been moved to our War Memorial Chapel for safe keeping. "Muster, March and Remember."

Every Regiment of the British Army has its own Regimental Collect, or prayer. The Royal Regiment of Scotland's was included in our service and goes like this: God of our fathers, whose hand shapes the coastlands and hills of home, fashion likewise our lives. Guard the Royal Regiment of Scotland; keep us brave in battle, resolute in adversity, loyal to comrade and Crown; that inspired by the faith and cross of Saint Andrew, we might secure lasting peace and eternal rest; through Jesus Christ our Saviour. Amen

#### NEWS FROM THE KIRK SESSION

There was no formal meeting of the Kirk Session in March; nevertheless it was a busy month. March saw the reintroduction of duty Elders' teams at Sunday services. This marks a return to the system that operated pre-pandemic, albeit in a slightly modified form. The Finance Committee has been busy preparing the Annual Accounts for 2022. Following approval by the Kirk Session at our meeting in February, the accounts were presented to the congregation at the Annual Congregational Meeting on Sunday 19<sup>th</sup> March. Having been noted by the congregation they now proceed to independent examination before being submitted to the Church of Scotland and the Office of the Scottish Charities Regulator (OSCR). In addition the Annual Review is being prepared for publication in the coming days and a few items of remedial work are being progressed with regard to the fabric of the Manse and the Harry Younger Hall. The Kirk Session is next due to meet on Monday 24<sup>th</sup> April.

Last Summer we marked The late Queen's Platinum Jubilee with a celebratory reception for the congregation immediately after the morning service. We plan to do something similar this year the morning after HM The King's coronation in Westminster Abbey. The morning service will inevitably mark the occasion and weather permitting everyone will be able to toast the newly crowned King at a reception in the courtyard. Help will be needed and volunteers will be welcome.

We have been blessed by a willing band of volunteers who press the necessary buttons on a laptop in the gallery every Sunday morning to enable the broadcast of our service online via our website. We know for a fact that this facility is appreciated not just locally and across the country but around the world. Friends in Australia, Japan and the USA watch regularly and we were recently joined for a baptism by someone stationed in Antarctica! These days numbers watching by the end of the week are generally averaging around 50 or 60, but the Sunday after The Queen's death they peaked at over 3600 and we can probably expect another spike around the time of The King's Coronation. It would be great to add to the number of those who help

#### **CRAFT CLUB**

The Canongate Craft Club had a successful inaugural meeting in February. Attendees worked on a variety of different crafts, including the knitting of baby blankets, cross-stitching and pom-pom making. #### **STAMPS**

Don't forget that we also have an ongoing collection for used stamps. This year's Stamp Project aims to raise funds for The National Evangelical Synod of Syria and Lebanon (NESSL). NESSL employs more than a thousand people including their pastors. The economic crisis in the country and the consequences of the huge explosion in Beirut has struck hard and the Synod is struggling to pay salaries for pastors which range between £100 to £150 per month. The money raised from stamp collections will go towards supporting a pastor for a full year's salary.

#### TEA AND COFFEE AFTER CHURCH

With thanks to those who have already volunteered to help with tea and coffee on a Sunday morning, anyone else wishing to help should give their name to David Croft who will coordinate the rota.
