

MINISTER'S LETTER

"Coming up to your busy time?!" That's what people often ask me when December comes round. I try to smile as if nobody's ever said it before, and as if it really doesn't imply that I'm kicking my heels for most of the year. Anyway, as August comes round it can safely be said that we are coming up to our busy time in Canongate Kirk. Our concert schedule for this year's Fringe is included elsewhere in this newsletter – do have a browse through it and see if there's anything that might appeal. There's something for everyone. Apart from concerts, Open Kirk is proving busy too, every day of the week. We are fortunate to have willing volunteers covering weekends, and Madalaine Wallace is already halfway through her student internship with us, ensuring that the church is also open Monday to Friday. Over the month of July, she has counted thousands of visitors coming through our red doors, the record so far being 944 in a day. She hopes to make four figures one day this month! A busy time indeed.

During the week 14th -21st August, the City Council has given permission to volunteers and staff from Richmond's Hope to set up a stand in our Kirkyard, to raise funds and awareness. This year this Craigmillar-based children's bereavement charity is celebrating its twentieth anniversary, and over those twenty years it has supported over 5000 bereaved families, an outstanding achievement. The culmination of its efforts to mark this significant milestone will be a "Mile of Memories" event in Holyrood Park on Sunday 3rd September, which will be well worth a visit. In the midst of our busy time, it's good to make time for such a thoroughly worthwhile cause.

ROBERT FERGUSSON

The much admired statue by David Annand at our front gate has been found to have a crack in the calf of the poet's left leg, which has made the statue unstable. It has been removed for repair and hopefully it won't be too long before Robert is back in his usual place.

MARGARET BUCHANAN

Still on the theme of historical figures with a Canongate connection, we have been informed that a portrait painted by Sir Henry Raeburn of the wife of The Revd Walter Buchanan is currently on display in the dining room of the National Trust for Scotland's Georgian House in Charlotte Square. It's part of a special exhibition which runs until November, marking the 200th anniversary of the artist's death and featuring a number of his Edinburgh portraits, all from the NTS collection. Walter Buchanan was minister here during the early decades of the nineteenth century, and overlapped with The Revd Robert Walker, more famously depicted by Raeburn as the Skating Minister! We have a large portrait of Walter on the back wall of the Kirk. His wife Margaret, who died in 1847, was a noted abolitionist in her own right.

SACRED ARTS FESTIVAL

The Edinburgh Festival of the Sacred Arts takes place annually as part of the Edinburgh Fringe running from Sunday 13th – Saturday 19th August. This year's expanded programme includes three exhibitions, seven musical events, drama, poetry and film plus the traditional opening and closing church services. Additional venues include St Mary's Episcopalian Cathedral, Greyfriars Kirk and St John's Princes Street. Canongate Kirk is also a venue with *Composing Sacred Music* on 16th August - showcasing the work of four of Edinburgh's newest young composers. Wednesday 16th August 1.15pm Edinburgh Sacred Arts Festival

Composing Sacred Music – A New Generation Showcasing the work of four of Edinburgh's newest young composers – Alexander McNamee, Carlo Massimo, Viktor Seifert and Lucy Whitehead, performed by a specially recruited professional choir, under the direction of Calum Robertson, director of Edinburgh University Singers.

Bach Handel Mozart John Cameron (piano) performs Mozart Piano Concerto No. 22 in Eb K.482 in the chamber version with strings. Handel Concerto Grosso Op. 6 No. 7 in Bb completes the programme.
