

## CANONGATE WAR MEMORIALS

There are six World War One memorials in or near the Canongate Kirk.

The main one is on the front of the Tolbooth (immediately west of the Kirk) and takes the form of a bronze panel on which a list of names is flanked by figures of a sailor and a kilted soldier. This is "to the memory of the men of the old Burgh of Canongate who nobly sacrificed their lives".

Inside the vestibule to the Kirk (on the east wall) is a marble memorial to casualties among members of the Canongate Parish Kirk.

Also in the Kirk vestibule (on the south wall) is a wooden memorial to members of the North Canongate kirk.

Above the stairs to the gallery in the Kirk is another wooden memorial, this for members of St Margaret's parish.

On the outside wall of the Kirk on the west side are three panel commemorating casualties among the staff of what ended up as the Scottish and Newcastle breweries in Abbey and Fountainbridge. Two (one World War One, one World War Two) are for staff of William Younger and Co, the other (World War One) for staff of "this brewery".
